

God, Our Father Verses In The New Testament

(Matthew 5:16) In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven.

(Matthew 5:45) that you may be sons of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous.

(Matthew 5:48) Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect.

(Matthew 6:1) "Be careful not to do your 'acts of righteousness' before men, to be seen by them. If you do, you will have no reward from your Father in heaven.

(Matthew 6:4) so that your giving may be in secret. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.

(Matthew 6:6) But when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.

(Matthew 6:8-9) Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him. {9} "This, then, is how you should pray: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,

(Matthew 6:14-15) For if you forgive men when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. {15} But if you do not forgive men their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins.

(Matthew 6:18) so that it will not be obvious to men that you are fasting, but only to your Father, who is unseen; and your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.

(Matthew 6:26) Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they?

(Matthew 6:32) For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them.

(Matthew 7:11) If you, then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him!

(Matthew 7:21) "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only he who does the will of my Father who is in heaven.

(Matthew 10:20) for it will not be you speaking, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you.

(Matthew 10:29) Are not two sparrows sold for a penny ? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground apart from the will of your Father.

(Matthew 10:32-33) "Whoever acknowledges me before men, I will also acknowledge him before my Father in heaven. {33} But whoever disowns me before men, I will disown him before my Father in heaven.

(Matthew 11:25-27) At that time Jesus said, "I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and learned, and revealed them to little children. {26} Yes, Father, for this was your good pleasure. {27} "All things have been committed to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and those to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

(Matthew 12:50) For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother."

(Matthew 13:43) Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. He who has ears, let him hear.

(Matthew 15:13) He replied, "Every plant that my heavenly Father has not planted will be pulled up by the roots.

(Matthew 16:17) Jesus replied, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by man, but by my Father in heaven.

(Matthew 18:10) "See that you do not look down on one of these little ones. For I tell you that their angels in heaven always see the face of my Father in heaven.

(Matthew 18:14) In the same way your Father in heaven is not willing that any of these little ones should be lost.

(Matthew 18:19) "Again, I tell you that if two of you on earth agree about anything you ask for, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven.

(Matthew 18:35) "This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother from your heart."

(Matthew 20:23) Jesus said to them, "You will indeed drink from my cup, but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared by my Father."

(Matthew 23:9) And do not call anyone on earth 'father,' for you have one Father, and he is in heaven.

(Matthew 24:36) "No one knows about that day or hour, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father.

(Matthew 25:34) "Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world.

(Matthew 26:39) Going a little farther, he fell with his face to the ground and prayed, "My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will."

(Matthew 26:42) He went away a second time and prayed, "My Father, if it is not possible for this cup to be taken away unless I drink it, may your will be done."

(Matthew 26:53) Do you think I cannot call on my Father, and he will at once put at my disposal more than twelve legions of angels?

(Matthew 28:19) Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

(Mark 11:25) And when you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive him, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you your sins."

(Mark 13:32) "No one knows about that day or hour, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father.

(Mark 14:36) "Abba, Father," he said, "everything is possible for you. Take this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will."

(Luke 6:36) Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

(Luke 9:26) If anyone is ashamed of me and my words, the Son of Man will be ashamed of him when he comes in his glory and in the glory of the Father and of the holy angels.

(Luke 10:21-22) At that time Jesus, full of joy through the Holy Spirit, said, "I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and learned, and revealed them to little children. Yes, Father, for this was your good pleasure. {22} "All things have been committed to me by my Father. No one knows who the Son is except the Father, and no one knows who the Father is except the Son and those to whom the Son chooses to reveal him."

(Luke 11:2) He said to them, "When you pray, say: "Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come.

(Luke 11:13) If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"

(Luke 12:30) For the pagan world runs after all such things, and your Father knows that you need them.

(Luke 12:32) "Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom.

(Luke 15:12) The younger one said to his father, 'Father, give me my share of the estate.' So he divided his property between them.

(Luke 15:18) I will set out and go back to my father and say to him: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you.

(Luke 15:21) "The son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.'

(Luke 16:24) So he called to him, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, because I am in agony in this fire.'

(Luke 22:29) And I confer on you a kingdom, just as my Father conferred one on me,

(Luke 22:42) "Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done."

(Luke 23:34) Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." And they divided up his clothes by casting lots.

(Luke 23:46) Jesus called out with a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." When he had said this, he breathed his last.

(Luke 24:49) I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

(John 1:14) The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

(John 3:35) The Father loves the Son and has placed everything in his hands.

(John 4:21) Jesus declared, "Believe me, woman, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem.

(John 4:23) Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks.

(John 5:17-23) Jesus said to them, "My Father is always at his work to this very day, and I, too, am working." {18} For this reason the Jews tried all the harder to kill him; not only was he breaking the Sabbath, but he was even calling God his own Father, making himself equal with God. {19} Jesus gave them this answer: "I tell you the truth, the Son can do nothing by himself; he can do only what he sees his Father doing, because whatever the Father does the Son also does. {20} For the Father loves the Son and shows him all he does. Yes, to your amazement he will show him even greater things than these. {21} For just as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, even so the Son gives life to whom he is pleased to give it. {22} Moreover, the Father judges no one, but has entrusted all judgment to the Son, {23} that all may honor the Son just as they honor the Father. He who does not honor the Son does not honor the Father, who sent him.

(John 5:26) For as the Father has life in himself, so he has granted the Son to have life in himself.

(John 5:36-37) "I have testimony weightier than that of John. For the very work that the Father has given me to finish, and which I am doing, testifies that the Father has sent me. {37} And the Father who sent me has himself testified concerning me. You have never heard his voice nor seen his form,

(John 5:45) "But do not think I will accuse you before the Father. Your accuser is Moses, on whom your hopes are set.

(John 6:27) Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. On him God the Father has placed his seal of approval."

(John 6:32) Jesus said to them, "I tell you the truth, it is not Moses who has given you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven.

(John 6:37) All that the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never drive away.

(John 6:44-46) "No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him, and I will raise him up at the last day. {45} It is written in the Prophets: 'They will all be taught by God.' Everyone who listens to the Father and learns from him comes to me. {46} No one has seen the Father except the one who is from God; only he has seen the Father.

(John 6:57) Just as the living Father sent me and I live because of the Father, so the one who feeds on me will live because of me.

(John 6:65) He went on to say, "This is why I told you that no one can come to me unless the Father has enabled him."

(John 8:16) But if I do judge, my decisions are right, because I am not alone. I stand with the Father, who sent me.

(John 8:18-19) I am one who testifies for myself; my other witness is the Father, who sent me." {19} Then they asked him, "Where is your father?" "You do not know me or my Father," Jesus replied. "If you knew me, you would know my Father also."

(John 8:27-28) They did not understand that he was telling them about his Father. {28} So Jesus said, "When you have lifted up the Son of Man, then you will know that I am the one I claim to be and that I do nothing on my own but speak just what the Father has taught me.

(John 8:41-42) You are doing the things your own father does." "We are not illegitimate children," they protested. "The only Father we have is God himself." {42} Jesus said to them, "If God were your Father, you would love me, for I came from God and now am here. I have not come on my own; but he sent me.

(John 8:49) "I am not possessed by a demon," said Jesus, "but I honor my Father and you dishonor me.

(John 8:54) Jesus replied, "If I glorify myself, my glory means nothing. My Father, whom you claim as your God, is the one who glorifies me.

(John 10:14-15) "I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me-- {15} just as the Father knows me and I know the Father--and I lay down my life for the sheep.

(John 10:17-18) The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life--only to take it up again. {18} No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down and authority to take it up again. This command I received from my Father."

(John 10:29-30) My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all ; no one can snatch them out of my Father's hand. {30} I and the Father are one."

(John 10:32) but Jesus said to them, "I have shown you many great miracles from the Father. For which of these do you stone me?"

(John 10:36-38) what about the one whom the Father set apart as his very own and sent into the world? Why then do you accuse me of blasphemy because I said, 'I am God's Son'? {37} Do not believe me unless I do what my Father does. {38} But if I do it, even though you do not believe me, believe the miracles, that you may know and understand that the Father is in me, and I in the Father."

(John 11:41) So they took away the stone. Then Jesus looked up and said, "Father, I thank you that you have heard me.

(John 12:26-28) Whoever serves me must follow me; and where I am, my servant also will be. My Father will honor the one who serves me. {27} "Now my heart is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it was for this very reason I came to this hour. {28} Father, glorify your name!" Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and will glorify it again."

(John 12:49-50) For I did not speak of my own accord, but the Father who sent me commanded me what to say and how to say it. {50} I know that his command leads to eternal life. So whatever I say is just what the Father has told me to say."

(John 13:1) It was just before the Passover Feast. Jesus knew that the time had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he now showed them the full extent of his love.

(John 13:3) Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under his power, and that he had come from God and was returning to God;

(John 14:6-13) Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. {7} If you really knew me, you would know my Father as well. From now on, you do know him and have seen him." {8} Philip said, "Lord, show us the Father and that will be enough for us." {9} Jesus answered: "Don't you know me, Philip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? {10} Don't you believe that I am in the Father, and that the Father is in me? The words I say to you are not just my own. Rather, it is the Father, living in me, who is doing his work. {11} Believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; or at least believe on the evidence of the miracles themselves. {12} I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. {13} And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Son may bring glory to the Father.

(John 14:16) And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Counselor to be with you forever--

(John 14:20-21) On that day you will realize that I am in my Father, and you are in me, and I am in you. {21} Whoever has my commands and obeys them, he is the one who loves me. He who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love him and show myself to him."

(John 14:23-24) Jesus replied, "If anyone loves me, he will obey my teaching. My Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. {24} He who does not love me will not obey my teaching. These words you hear are not my own; they belong to the Father who sent me.

(John 14:26) But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you.

(John 14:28) "You heard me say, 'I am going away and I am coming back to you.' If you loved me, you would be glad that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I.

(John 14:31) but the world must learn that I love the Father and that I do exactly what my Father has commanded me. "Come now; let us leave.

(John 15:1) "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener.

(John 15:9) "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love.

(John 15:15-16) I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. {16} You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit--fruit that will last. Then the Father will give you whatever you ask in my name.

(John 15:23-24) He who hates me hates my Father as well. {24} If I had not done among them what no one else did, they would not be guilty of sin. But now they have seen these miracles, and yet they have hated both me and my Father.

(John 15:26) "When the Counselor comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who goes out from the Father, he will testify about me.

(John 16:3) They will do such things because they have not known the Father or me.

(John 16:10) in regard to righteousness, because I am going to the Father, where you can see me no longer;

(John 16:15) All that belongs to the Father is mine. That is why I said the Spirit will take from what is mine and make it known to you.

(John 16:17) Some of his disciples said to one another, "What does he mean by saying, 'In a little while you will see me no more, and then after a little while you will see me,' and 'Because I am going to the Father'?"

(John 16:23) In that day you will no longer ask me anything. I tell you the truth, my Father will give you whatever you ask in my name.

(John 16:25-28) "Though I have been speaking figuratively, a time is coming when I will no longer use this kind of language but will tell you plainly about my Father. {26} In that day you will ask in my name. I am not saying that I will ask the Father on your behalf. {27} No, the Father himself loves you because you have loved me and have believed that

I came from God. {28} I came from the Father and entered the world; now I am leaving the world and going back to the Father."

(John 16:32) "But a time is coming, and has come, when you will be scattered, each to his own home. You will leave me all alone. Yet I am not alone, for my Father is with me.

(John 17:1) After Jesus said this, he looked toward heaven and prayed: "Father, the time has come. Glorify your Son, that your Son may glorify you.

(John 17:5) And now, Father, glorify me in your presence with the glory I had with you before the world began.

(John 17:11) I will remain in the world no longer, but they are still in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them by the power of your name--the name you gave me--so that they may be one as we are one.

(John 17:21) that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me.

(John 17:24-25) "Father, I want those you have given me to be with me where I am, and to see my glory, the glory you have given me because you loved me before the creation of the world. {25} "Righteous Father, though the world does not know you, I know you, and they know that you have sent me.

(John 18:11) Jesus commanded Peter, "Put your sword away! Shall I not drink the cup the Father has given me?"

(John 20:17) Jesus said, "Do not hold on to me, for I have not yet returned to the Father. Go instead to my brothers and tell them, 'I am returning to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'"

(John 20:21) Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you."

(Acts 1:4) On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about.

(Acts 1:7) He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority.

(Acts 2:33) Exalted to the right hand of God, he has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear.

(Acts 13:33) he has fulfilled for us, their children, by raising up Jesus. As it is written in the second Psalm: "'You are my Son; today I have become your Father.'

(Romans 1:7) To all in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints: Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

(Romans 6:4) We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.

(Romans 8:15) For you did not receive a spirit that makes you a slave again to fear, but you received the Spirit of sonship. And by him we cry, "Abba, Father."

(Romans 15:6) so that with one heart and mouth you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

(1 Corinthians 1:3) Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

(1 Corinthians 8:6) yet for us there is but one God, the Father, from whom all things came and for whom we live; and there is but one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom all things came and through whom we live.

(1 Corinthians 15:24) Then the end will come, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father after he has destroyed all dominion, authority and power.

(2 Corinthians 1:2-3) Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. {3} Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort,

(2 Corinthians 6:18) "I will be a Father to you, and you will be my sons and daughters," says the Lord Almighty."

(2 Corinthians 11:31) The God and Father of the Lord Jesus, who is to be praised forever, knows that I am not lying.

(Galatians 1:1) Paul, an apostle--sent not from men nor by man, but by Jesus Christ and God the Father, who raised him from the dead--

(Galatians 1:3-4) Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ, {4} who gave himself for our sins to rescue us from the present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father,

(Galatians 4:6) Because you are sons, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, the Spirit who calls out, "Abba, Father."

(Ephesians 1:2-3) Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. {3} Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ.

(Ephesians 1:17) I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better.

(Ephesians 2:18) For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit.

(Ephesians 3:14) For this reason I kneel before the Father,

(Ephesians 4:6) one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

(Ephesians 5:20) always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

(Ephesians 6:23) Peace to the brothers, and love with faith from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

(Philippians 1:2) Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

(Philippians 2:11) and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

(Philippians 4:20) To our God and Father be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

(Colossians 1:2-3) To the holy and faithful brothers in Christ at Colosse: Grace and peace to you from God our Father. {3} We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you,

(Colossians 1:12) giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the kingdom of light.

(Colossians 3:17) And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

(1 Thessalonians 1:1) Paul, Silas and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace and peace to you.

(1 Thessalonians 1:3) We continually remember before our God and Father your work produced by faith, your labor prompted by love, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.

(1 Thessalonians 3:11) Now may our God and Father himself and our Lord Jesus clear the way for us to come to you.

(1 Thessalonians 3:13) May he strengthen your hearts so that you will be blameless and holy in the presence of our God and Father when our Lord Jesus comes with all his holy ones.

(2 Thessalonians 1:1-2) Paul, Silas and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: {2} Grace and peace to you from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

(2 Thessalonians 2:16) May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who loved us and by his grace gave us eternal encouragement and good hope,

(1 Timothy 1:2) To Timothy my true son in the faith: Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

(2 Timothy 1:2) To Timothy, my dear son: Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

(Titus 1:4) To Titus, my true son in our common faith: Grace and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Savior.

(Philemon 1:3) Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

(Hebrews 1:5) For to which of the angels did God ever say, "You are my Son; today I have become your Father " ? Or again, "I will be his Father, and he will be my Son"?

(Hebrews 5:5) So Christ also did not take upon himself the glory of becoming a high priest. But God said to him, "You are my Son; today I have become your Father."

(Hebrews 12:9) Moreover, we have all had human fathers who disciplined us and we respected them for it. How much more should we submit to the Father of our spirits and live!

(James 1:17) Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows.

(James 1:27) Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.

(James 3:9) With the tongue we praise our Lord and Father, and with it we curse men, who have been made in God's likeness.

(1 Peter 1:2-3) who have been chosen according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, through the sanctifying work of the Spirit, for obedience to Jesus Christ and sprinkling by his blood: Grace and peace be yours in abundance. {3} Praise be to the God and Father of

our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,

(1 Peter 1:17) Since you call on a Father who judges each man's work impartially, live your lives as strangers here in reverent fear.

(2 Peter 1:17) For he received honor and glory from God the Father when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."

(1 John 1:2-3) The life appeared; we have seen it and testify to it, and we proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and has appeared to us. {3} We proclaim to you what we have seen and heard, so that you also may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ.

(1 John 2:1) My dear children, I write this to you so that you will not sin. But if anybody does sin, we have one who speaks to the Father in our defense--Jesus Christ, the Righteous One.

(1 John 2:13) I write to you, fathers, because you have known him who is from the beginning. I write to you, young men, because you have overcome the evil one. I write to you, dear children, because you have known the Father.

(1 John 2:15-16) Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. {16} For everything in the world--the cravings of sinful man, the lust of his eyes and the boasting of what he has and does--comes not from the Father but from the world.

(1 John 2:22-24) Who is the liar? It is the man who denies that Jesus is the Christ. Such a man is the antichrist--he denies the Father and the Son. {23} No one who denies the Son has the Father; whoever acknowledges the Son has the Father also. {24} See that what you have heard from the beginning remains in you. If it does, you also will remain in the Son and in the Father.

(1 John 3:1) How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him.

(1 John 4:14) And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world.

(2 John 1:3-4) Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and from Jesus Christ, the Father's Son, will be with us in truth and love. {4} It has given me great joy to find some of your children walking in the truth, just as the Father commanded us.

(2 John 1:9) Anyone who runs ahead and does not continue in the teaching of Christ does not have God; whoever continues in the teaching has both the Father and the Son.

(Jude 1:1) Jude, a servant of Jesus Christ and a brother of James, To those who have been called, who are loved by God the Father and kept by Jesus Christ:

(Revelation 1:6) and has made us to be a kingdom and priests to serve his God and Father--to him be glory and power for ever and ever! Amen.

(Revelation 2:27) **'He will rule them with an iron scepter; he will dash them to pieces like pottery' -- just as I have received authority from my Father.**

(Revelation 3:5) **He who overcomes will, like them, be dressed in white. I will never blot out his name from the book of life, but will acknowledge his name before my Father and his angels.**

(Revelation 3:21) **To him who overcomes, I will give the right to sit with me on my throne, just as I overcame and sat down with my Father on his throne.**
