(Matthew 3:17) And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."

(Matthew 5:43-44) "You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' {44} But I tell you: Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you,

(Matthew 5:46) If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that?

(Matthew 6:5) "And when you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by men. I tell you the truth, they have received their reward in full.

(Matthew 6:24) "No one can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and Money.

(Matthew 10:37) "Anyone who loves his father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; anyone who loves his son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me;

(Matthew 12:18) "Here is my servant whom I have chosen, the one I love, in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him, and he will proclaim justice to the nations.

(Matthew 17:5) While he was still speaking, a bright cloud enveloped them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!"

(Matthew 19:19) honor your father and mother,' and 'love your neighbor as yourself.'"

(Matthew 22:37) Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.'

(Matthew 22:39) And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'

(Matthew 23:6-7) they love the place of honor at banquets and the most important seats in the synagogues; {7} they love to be greeted in the marketplaces and to have men call them 'Rabbi.'

(Matthew 24:12) Because of the increase of wickedness, the love of most will grow cold,

(Mark 1:11) And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."

(Mark 9:7) Then a cloud appeared and enveloped them, and a voice came from the cloud: "This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!"

(Mark 10:21) Jesus looked at him and loved him. "One thing you lack," he said. "Go, sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me."

(Mark 12:6) "He had one left to send, a son, whom he loved. He sent him last of all, saying, 'They will respect my son.'"

(Mark 12:30-31) Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' {31} The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these."

(Mark 12:33) To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself is more important than all burnt offerings and sacrifices."

(Luke 3:22) and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."

(Luke 6:27) "But I tell you who hear me: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you,

(Luke 6:32) "If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even 'sinners' love those who love them.

(Luke 6:35) But love your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them without expecting to get anything back. Then your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High, because he is kind to the ungrateful and wicked.

(Luke 7:42) Neither of them had the money to pay him back, so he canceled the debts of both. Now which of them will love him more?"

(Luke 7:47) Therefore, I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven--for she loved much. But he who has been forgiven little loves little."

(Luke 10:27) He answered: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind' ; and, 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'"

(Luke 11:42-43) "Woe to you Pharisees, because you give God a tenth of your mint, rue and all other kinds of garden herbs, but you neglect justice and the love of God. You should have practiced the latter without leaving the former undone. {43} "Woe to you Pharisees, because you love the most important seats in the synagogues and greetings in the marketplaces.

(Luke 16:13-14) "No servant can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and Money." {14} The Pharisees, who loved money, heard all this and were sneering at Jesus.

(Luke 20:9-18) He went on to tell the people this parable: "A man planted a vineyard, rented it to some farmers and went away for a long time. {10} At harvest time he sent a servant to the tenants so they would give him some of the fruit of the vineyard. But the tenants beat him and sent him away empty-handed. {11} He sent another servant, but that one also they beat and treated shamefully and sent away empty-handed. {12} He sent still a third, and they wounded him and threw him out.

{13} "Then the owner of the vineyard said, 'What shall I do? I will send my son, whom I love; perhaps they will respect him.' {14} "But when the tenants saw him, they talked the matter over. 'This is the heir,' they said. 'Let's kill him, and the inheritance will be ours.' {15} So they threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. "What then will the owner of the vineyard do to them? {16} He will come and kill those tenants and give the vineyard to others." When the people heard this, they said, "May this never be!" {17} Jesus looked directly at them and asked, "Then what is the meaning of that which is written: "The stone the builders rejected has become the capstone"? {18} Everyone who falls on that stone will be broken to pieces, but he on whom it falls will be crushed."

(John 3:16) "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

(John 3:35) The Father loves the Son and has placed everything in his hands.

(John 5:20) For the Father loves the Son and shows him all he does. Yes, to your amazement he will show him even greater things than these.

(John 5:41-42) "I do not accept praise from men, {42} but I know you. I know that you do not have the love of God in your hearts.

(John 8:42) Jesus said to them, "If God were your Father, you would love me, for I came from God and now am here. I have not come on my own; but he sent me.

(John 10:17) The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life--only to take it up again.

(John 12:25) The man who loves his life will lose it, while the man who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life.

(John 13:1) It was just before the Passover Feast. Jesus knew that the time had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he now showed them the full extent of his love.

(John 13:23) One of them, the disciple whom Jesus loved, was reclining next to him.

(John 13:34-35) "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. {35} By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

(John 14:15) "If you love me, you will obey what I command.

(John 14:21) Whoever has my commands and obeys them, he is the one who loves me. He who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love him and show myself to him."

(John 14:23-24) Jesus replied, "If anyone loves me, he will obey my teaching. My Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. {24} He who does not love me will not obey my teaching. These words you hear are not my own; they belong to the Father who sent me.

(John 14:28) "You heard me say, 'I am going away and I am coming back to you.' If you loved me, you would be glad that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I.

(John 14:31) but the world must learn that I love the Father and that I do exactly what my Father has commanded me. "Come now; let us leave.

(John 15:9-10) "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. {10} If you obey my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have obeyed my Father's commands and remain in his love.

(John 15:12-13) My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. {13} Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends.

(John 15:17) This is my command: Love each other.

(John 15:19) If you belonged to the world, it would love you as its own. As it is, you do not belong to the world, but I have chosen you out of the world. That is why the world hates you.

(John 16:27) No, the Father himself loves you because you have loved me and have believed that I came from God.

(John 17:23-24) I in them and you in me. May they be brought to complete unity to let the world know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me. {24} "Father, I want those you have given me to be with me where I am, and to see my glory, the glory you have given me because you loved me before the creation of the world.

(John 17:26) I have made you known to them, and will continue to make you known in order that the love you have for me may be in them and that I myself may be in them."

(John 21:15-17) When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you truly love me more than these?" "Yes, Lord," he said, "you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Feed my lambs." {16} Again Jesus said, "Simon son of John, do you truly love me?" He answered, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Take care of my sheep." {17} The third time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, "Do you love me?" He said, "Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Feed my sheep.

(Romans 1:7) To all in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints: Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

(Romans 5:5) And hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out his love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom he has given us.

(Romans 5:8) But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

(Romans 8:28) And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.

(Romans 8:35) Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword?

(Romans 8:37) No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.

(Romans 8:39) neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

(Romans 9:25) As he says in Hosea: "I will call them 'my people' who are not my people; and I will call her 'my loved one' who is not my loved one,"

(Romans 12:9-10) Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. {10} Be devoted to one another in brotherly love. Honor one another above yourselves.

(Romans 13:8-10) Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for he who loves his fellowman has fulfilled the law. {9} The commandments, "Do not commit adultery," "Do not murder," "Do not steal," "Do not covet," and whatever other commandment there may be, are summed up in this one rule: "Love your neighbor as yourself." {10} Love does no harm to its neighbor. Therefore love is the fulfillment of the law.

(Romans 14:15) If your brother is distressed because of what you eat, you are no longer acting in love. Do not by your eating destroy your brother for whom Christ died.

(Romans 15:30) I urge you, brothers, by our Lord Jesus Christ and by the love of the Spirit, to join me in my struggle by praying to God for me.

(1 Corinthians 2:9) However, as it is written: "No eye has seen, no ear has heard, no mind has conceived what God has prepared for those who love him"--

(1 Corinthians 4:17) For this reason I am sending to you Timothy, my son whom I love, who is faithful in the Lord. He will remind you of my way of life in Christ Jesus, which agrees with what I teach everywhere in every church.

(1 Corinthians 4:21) What do you prefer? Shall I come to you with a whip, or in love and with a gentle spirit?

(1 Corinthians 8:1) Now about food sacrificed to idols: We know that we all possess knowledge. Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up.

(1 Corinthians 8:3) But the man who loves God is known by God.

(1 Corinthians 13:1-4) If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. {2} If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. {3} If I give all I possess to the poor and surrender my body to the flames, but have not love, I gain nothing. {4} Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud.

(1 Corinthians 13:6) Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth.

(1 Corinthians 13:8) Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away.

(1 Corinthians 13:13) And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.

(1 Corinthians 14:1) Follow the way of love and eagerly desire spiritual gifts, especially the gift of prophecy.

(1 Corinthians 16:14) Do everything in love.

(1 Corinthians 16:22) If anyone does not love the Lord--a curse be on him. Come, O Lord !

(2 Corinthians 2:4) For I wrote you out of great distress and anguish of heart and with many tears, not to grieve you but to let you know the depth of my love for you.

(2 Corinthians 2:8) I urge you, therefore, to reaffirm your love for him.

(2 Corinthians 5:14) For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died.

(2 Corinthians 6:6) in purity, understanding, patience and kindness; in the Holy Spirit and in sincere love;

(2 Corinthians 8:7-8) But just as you excel in everything--in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in your love for us --see that you also excel in this grace of giving. {8} I am not commanding you, but I want to test the sincerity of your love by comparing it with the earnestness of others.

(2 Corinthians 8:24) Therefore show these men the proof of your love and the reason for our pride in you, so that the churches can see it.

(2 Corinthians 9:7) Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

(2 Corinthians 11:11) Why? Because I do not love you? God knows I do!

(2 Corinthians 12:15) So I will very gladly spend for you everything I have and expend myself as well. If I love you more, will you love me less?

(2 Corinthians 13:11) Finally, brothers, good-bye. Aim for perfection, listen to my appeal, be of one mind, live in peace. And the God of love and peace will be with you.

(2 Corinthians 13:14) May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

(Galatians 2:20) I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.

(Galatians 5:6) For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision has any value. The only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love.

(Galatians 5:13-14) You, my brothers, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature ; rather, serve one another in love. {14} The entire law is summed up in a single command: "Love your neighbor as yourself."

(Galatians 5:22) But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,

(Ephesians 1:4) For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love

(Ephesians 1:4-6) For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love {5} he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will-- {6} to the praise of his glorious grace, which he has freely given us in the One he loves.

(Ephesians 1:15-16) For this reason, ever since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all the saints, {16} I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers.

(Ephesians 2:4-5) But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, {5} made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions--it is by grace you have been saved.

(Ephesians 3:17-19) so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, {18} may have power, together with all the saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, {19} and to know this love that surpasses knowledge--that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.

(Ephesians 4:2) Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love.

(Ephesians 4:15-16) Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will in all things grow up into him who is the Head, that is, Christ. {16} From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.

(Ephesians 5:1-2) Be imitators of God, therefore, as dearly loved children {2} and live a life of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

(Ephesians 5:25) Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her

(Ephesians 5:28) In this same way, husbands ought to love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself.

(Ephesians 5:33) However, each one of you also must love his wife as he loves himself, and the wife must respect her husband.

(Ephesians 6:23-24) Peace to the brothers, and love with faith from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. {24} Grace to all who love our Lord Jesus Christ with an undying love.

(Philippians 1:9) And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight,

(Philippians 1:16) The latter do so in love, knowing that I am put here for the defense of the gospel.

(Philippians 2:1-2) If you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any fellowship with the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, {2} then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose.

(Philippians 4:1) Therefore, my brothers, you whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, that is how you should stand firm in the Lord, dear friends!

(Colossians 1:3-6) We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, {4} because we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love you have for all the saints-- {5} the faith and love that spring from the hope that is stored up for you in heaven and that you have already heard about in the word of truth, the gospel {6} that has come to you. All over the world this gospel is bearing fruit and growing, just as it has been doing among you since the day you heard it and understood God's grace in all its truth.

(Colossians 1:7-8) You learned it from Epaphras, our dear fellow servant, who is a faithful minister of Christ on our behalf, {8} and who also told us of your love in the Spirit.

(Colossians 1:13) For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves,

(Colossians 2:2) My purpose is that they may be encouraged in heart and united in love, so that they may have the full riches of complete understanding, in order that they may know the mystery of God, namely, Christ,

(Colossians 3:12) Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience.

(Colossians 3:14) And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.

(Colossians 3:19) Husbands, love your wives and do not be harsh with them.

(1 Thessalonians 1:3-4) We continually remember before our God and Father your work produced by faith, your labor prompted by love, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. {4} For we know, brothers loved by God, that he has chosen you,

(1 Thessalonians 2:8) We loved you so much that we were delighted to share with you not only the gospel of God but our lives as well, because you had become so dear to us.

(1 Thessalonians 3:6) But Timothy has just now come to us from you and has brought good news about your faith and love. He has told us that you always have pleasant memories of us and that you long to see us, just as we also long to see you.

(1 Thessalonians 3:12) May the Lord make your love increase and overflow for each other and for everyone else, just as ours does for you.

(1 Thessalonians 4:9-10) Now about brotherly love we do not need to write to you, for you yourselves have been taught by God to love each other. {10} And in fact, you do love all the brothers throughout Macedonia. Yet we urge you, brothers, to do so more and more.

(1 Thessalonians 5:8) But since we belong to the day, let us be self-controlled, putting on faith and love as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet.

(1 Thessalonians 5:13) Hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work. Live in peace with each other.

(2 Thessalonians 1:3) We ought always to thank God for you, brothers, and rightly so, because your faith is growing more and more, and the love every one of you has for each other is increasing.

(2 Thessalonians 2:13) But we ought always to thank God for you, brothers loved by the Lord, because from the beginning God chose you to be saved through the sanctifying work of the Spirit and through belief in the truth.

(2 Thessalonians 2:16) May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who loved us and by his grace gave us eternal encouragement and good hope,

(2 Thessalonians 3:5) May the Lord direct your hearts into God's love and Christ's perseverance.

(1 Timothy 1:5) The goal of this command is love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.

(1 Timothy 1:14) The grace of our Lord was poured out on me abundantly, along with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus.

(1 Timothy 2:15) But women will be saved through childbearing--if they continue in faith, love and holiness with propriety.

(1 Timothy 4:12) Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in life, in love, in faith and in purity.

(1 Timothy 6:10-11) For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs. {11} But you, man of God, flee from all this, and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance and gentleness.

(2 Timothy 1:7) For God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and of self-discipline.

(2 Timothy 1:13) What you heard from me, keep as the pattern of sound teaching, with faith and love in Christ Jesus.

(2 Timothy 2:22) Flee the evil desires of youth, and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart.

(2 Timothy 3:10) You, however, know all about my teaching, my way of life, my purpose, faith, patience, love, endurance,

(Titus 1:8) Rather he must be hospitable, one who loves what is good, who is self-controlled, upright, holy and disciplined.

(Titus 2:2) Teach the older men to be temperate, worthy of respect, self-controlled, and sound in faith, in love and in endurance.

(Titus 2:4) Then they can train the younger women to love their husbands and children,

(Titus 3:4-7) But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, {5} he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, {6} whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, {7} so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life.

(Titus 3:15) Everyone with me sends you greetings. Greet those who love us in the faith. Grace be with you all.

(Philemon 1:4-5) I always thank my God as I remember you in my prayers, {5} because I hear about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all the saints.

(Philemon 1:7) Your love has given me great joy and encouragement, because you, brother, have refreshed the hearts of the saints.

(Philemon 1:9) yet I appeal to you on the basis of love. I then, as Paul--an old man and now also a prisoner of Christ Jesus--

(Hebrews 1:9) You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness; therefore God, your God, has set you above your companions by anointing you with the oil of joy."

(Hebrews 6:10) God is not unjust; he will not forget your work and the love you have shown him as you have helped his people and continue to help them.

(Hebrews 10:24) And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds.

(Hebrews 12:6) because the Lord disciplines those he loves, and he punishes everyone he accepts as a son."

(Hebrews 13:1) Keep on loving each other as brothers.

(Hebrews 13:5) Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said, "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you."

(James 1:12) Blessed is the man who perseveres under trial, because when he has stood the test, he will receive the crown of life that God has promised to those who love him.

(James 2:5) Listen, my dear brothers: Has not God chosen those who are poor in the eyes of the world to be rich in faith and to inherit the kingdom he promised those who love him?

(James 2:8) If you really keep the royal law found in Scripture, "Love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing right.

(James 3:17) But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere.

(1 Peter 1:8) Though you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy,

(1 Peter 1:22) Now that you have purified yourselves by obeying the truth so that you have sincere love for your brothers, love one another deeply, from the heart.

(1 Peter 2:17) Show proper respect to everyone: Love the brotherhood of believers, fear God, honor the king.

(1 Peter 3:8) Finally, all of you, live in harmony with one another; be sympathetic, love as brothers, be compassionate and humble.

(1 Peter 3:10) For, "Whoever would love life and see good days must keep his tongue from evil and his lips from deceitful speech.

(1 Peter 4:8) Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins.

(1 Peter 5:14) Greet one another with a kiss of love. Peace to all of you who are in Christ.

(2 Peter 1:5-7) For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; {6} and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; {7} and to godliness, brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness, love.

(2 Peter 1:17) For he received honor and glory from God the Father when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."

(2 Peter 2:15) They have left the straight way and wandered off to follow the way of Balaam son of Beor, who loved the wages of wickedness.

(1 John 2:5) But if anyone obeys his word, God's love is truly made complete in him. This is how we know we are in him:

(1 John 2:10) Whoever loves his brother lives in the light, and there is nothing in him to make him stumble.

(1 John 2:15) Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him.

(1 John 3:1) How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him.

(1 John 3:10-11) This is how we know who the children of God are and who the children of the devil are: Anyone who does not do what is right is not a child of God; nor is anyone who does not love his brother. {11} This is the message you heard from the beginning: We should love one another.

(1 John 3:14) We know that we have passed from death to life, because we love our brothers. Anyone who does not love remains in death.

(1 John 3:16-18) This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers. {17} If anyone has material possessions and sees his brother in need but has no pity on him, how can the love of God be in him? {18} Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth.

(1 John 3:23) And this is his command: to believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and to love one another as he commanded us.

(1 John 4:7-12) Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. {8} Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. {9} This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him.

{10} This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. {11} Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. {12} No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.

(1 John 4:16-21) And so we know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in him. {17} In this way, love is made complete among us so that we will have confidence on the day of judgment, because in this world we are like him. {18} There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love.

{19} We love because he first loved us. {20} If anyone says, "I love God," yet hates his brother, he is a liar. For anyone who does not love his brother, whom he has seen, cannot love God, whom he has not seen. {21} And he has given us this command: Whoever loves God must also love his brother.

(1 John 5:1-3) Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is born of God, and everyone who loves the father loves his child as well. {2} This is how we know that we love the children of God: by loving God and carrying out his commands. {3} This is love for God: to obey his commands. And his commands are not burdensome,

(2 John 1:3) Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and from Jesus Christ, the Father's Son, will be with us in truth and love.

(2 John 1:5-6) And now, dear lady, I am not writing you a new command but one we have had from the beginning. I ask that we love one another. {6} And this is love: that we walk in obedience to his commands. As you have heard from the beginning, his command is that you walk in love.

(3 John 1:6) They have told the church about your love. You will do well to send them on their way in a manner worthy of God.

(Jude 1:1-2) Jude, a servant of Jesus Christ and a brother of James, To those who have been called, who are loved by God the Father and kept by Jesus Christ: {2} Mercy, peace and love be yours in abundance.

(Jude 1:21) Keep yourselves in God's love as you wait for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to bring you to eternal life.

(Revelation 1:5) and from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth. To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood,

(Revelation 2:4) **Yet I hold this against you: You have forsaken your first love.**

(Revelation 2:19) **I know your deeds, your love and faith, your service and perseverance, and that you are now doing more than you did at first.**

(Revelation 3:9) **I will make those who are of the synagogue of Satan, who claim to be Jews though they are not, but are liars--I will make them come and fall down at your feet and acknowledge that I have loved you.**

(Revelation 3:19) **Those whom I love I rebuke and discipline. So be earnest, and repent.**

(Revelation 12:11) They overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony; they did not love their lives so much as to shrink from death.

(Revelation 20:9) They marched across the breadth of the earth and surrounded the camp of God's people, the city he loves. But fire came down from heaven and devoured them.
